One Word Can Change **Everything**

The case of "intoxicado" - mistranslated as "intoxicated" instead of "poisoned" - led to a tragic diagnosis delay and permanent neurological injury.

Real-World Impact: This true story from a Florida emergency room reminds us that precision in language is as critical as precision in medicine. The patient's family mentioned he was "intoxicado" from spoiled food, but staff interpreted this as drug intoxication rather than food poisoning, delaying proper treatment for days.


